# 6. School Uniform

# Standard Uniform

All pupils are required to wear a school uniform which consists of:

- A royal blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan optional during summer months
- A red or white polo shirt or blouse
- Grey or dark trousers/skirt
- A blue checked dress if desired

# PE Kit

Pupils also need a PE kit which consists of:

- A plain red t-shirt
- Black shorts
- PE pumps/trainers

## Swimming

For swimming sessions pupils require:

- Trunks/costume
- A towel

For reasons of hygiene and health and safety, families of those pupils with incontinence needs can order from school 'freestyle' swimming pants for use under costumes or order these directly online from <u>http://www.incywincy.net</u>

For both PE and swimming programmes pupils need to provide a toiletry bag containing soap/shower gel and shampoo for use in showering programmes that follow physical activities (when appropriate).

Pupils who swim off site are able to access the cafeteria at the leisure centre and so they may be asked to bring a donation for purchasing a hot drink.

#### Menus and allergy information

These lunch menus are provided at many schools and academies in Wolverhampton. Some schools may request changes or provide an additional choice. Your child's school will be able to confirm the menu on offer.

Some of our menu items contain allergens, including cereals containing Gluten, Milk, Eggs, Fish, Shellfish, Soya, Celery, Mustard, Sulphites, Sesame and Lupin.

Peanuts and Nuts are also classed as allergens, but these are not used on our menu.

City of Wolverhampton Council is happy to cater for special diets by prior arrangement.

You must inform us of any food allergy or intolerance and/or other medical conditions.

Please ask your child's dietician to contact us in the first instance.

#### **Packed Lunches**

If preferred, you more than welcome to send your child into school with a packed lunch from home. If pupils have specific dietary/feeding needs which require staff to re-heat pre-cooked food, then please make individual arrangements with class teams.

All pupils at Green Park have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). At the End of every Key Stage, their plans are reviewed and updated and a formal annual review takes place with all professionals who are involved in caring for your child. This includes our pupil warfare manager, class teacher and health professionals. This is a chance for you to raise any concerns or suggest changes to their plan.

## 9. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

- What are the times of the school day?
  School starts at 8:50am and finishes at 3:15pm. Please find more information regarding times of the school day here.
- How do I report a child absence or illness?
  Please ring our school on 01902 556429 and follow instructions to report your child's absence.

#### • What do I do if my child is late to school?

Bring your child to the main reception and speak to our school Administration Assistant Mrs Sharon Banger, who will sign them in and ring class staff to come and collect your child. \*Add information here about being late for school transport? #### • How do I send a message or contact school?

Each pupil will have a home/school diary which should be sent into school each day to communicate between families and classes. Here your pupils' class staff team will write information about how your child's day has been. You can also write any messages, questions or information you would like the class team to know about your child on a daily basis.

At school we also use the EfL app to send home wow moments of pupils' learning and progress. You are also able to send your own photos, videos or messages to the class team via the app.

If you would like to speak to someone, please ring our school on **01902 556429** and follow the instructions. Reception is available between 8:30am and 4.00pm. If you contact us by phone, you will either be able to leave a message or speak to one of our Administration Team. Mrs Sharon Banger is our school Administration Assistant and she will be able to help you with any enquires. If you do leave a message the reception team will pick up these messages as soon as possible. If you wish to contact a class team the reception staff will pass on your message in-between lesson times unless it is an emergency.

#### • When is the next parents evening?

Our next parents evening is held on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> July 2024.

#### • When is half term?

School will be closed for INSET DAYS Thursday 23rd May & Friday 24th May. May half term is week commencing Monday 27<sup>th</sup> May. Pupils will return to school on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2024.

- When does school break up for the Summer Holidays? The last day of school for pupils is Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2024. School will be closed for INSET DAY on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July.
- When do pupils return to school after the Summer Holidays? Pupils return to school on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2024.
- How is my child prepared for life after Green Park?

From Y9 onwards pupils are allocated a Connections officer who will begin to support them on their journey up until they leave in Y14. The class staff and wider school team around the pupil work hard to support pupils next steps and transition. At school we have a range of events to support this process such as Post 16 Providers Tour, Talks and workshops, Person Centred Plan meetings and personal guidance sessions for Y11 and post 16 students.

# • What assessment and accreditation will my child complete?

At Green Park pupils follow ASDAN assessments. All students in Y10 begin a two year 'Transition Challenge' programme. Depending on their Learning Style, they will complete a 'Sensory' or 'Induction' module.

In Y12, those who followed the Induction programme move on to 'Personal Progress Units' (PPU's).

Sensory learners follow 'Towards Independence' modules. These accreditation courses are continued until students leave Green Park in Y14.

# • Will my child attend off-site visits?

Throughout their time at Green Park, Pupils can access a range of off-site visits and trips to further extended their learning beyond the classroom. All school trips are thoroughly planned and risk assessed. You will be sent out letters regarding specific trips which are available to your child. Previous school trips have included visiting local shops, Chasewater, Breathing Space, Bilston College and off-site swimming.
