

The Leavers Journey

All Pupils from year 9 onwards

Their Annual Review will be called a Preparing for Adulthood/transition review

Starting to think about your young person's future.

3 - 4 years prior to starting college after Green Park

Attend Open Days. These are advertised on providers websites. You may take your young person or visit on your own. Review and assess whether the College can meet the young person's needs.

2 - 3 years prior to starting college

If you feel colleges can meet your young person's needs. Complete and submit an Admissions Enquiry Form. All establishments have different guidelines. Ask questions that are pertinent to your young person.

Extremely important to begin the process now if you are considering specialist college places.

Year 11 Review for all pupils

Connexions will attend the review and meet with your young person in their school setting. This allows them to get to know the young person and gather up to date information. Thus, enabling them to complete their Career Pathway Plans.

When you find a preferred setting:

Submit the Admissions Application Form. You will need to submit key documents for example-
EHCP Learning Support Plan
Career Pathway Plan

Step by Step support for a successful admission after Green Park:

- Year 8 - start thinking ahead about your aspirations and dreams,
- Year 9 - attend EHCP Annual Review as there is a focus on preparing for Adulthood. Including: Employment and education, independent living, friends, relationships community and being healthy as an adult. Connexions attend reviews and meet the young person.
- Year 10 - Green Park curriculum supports aspirations, promotes wellbeing and independence skills. In this year, visit colleges, day provisions and attend open days - consider work experience or volunteering too.
- Year 11 - You will have input from career advisors, explore housing options here if relevant. If needed, complete NHS continuing health care checklist, consider mental capacity and best interest decisions . Make referrals in year 11, for assessments to confirm eligibility for adult care at age 18.
- Year 12 - Green Park Curriculum promotes independence, wellbeing, and pathways to employment if relevant and school can involve adult services if applicable.
- Year 13 - Connexions provide advice at EHCP review and confirm if transfer is taking place from children's services to adult services.
- Year 14 - Decide on a pathway option if going to a college (e.g. supported internships, supported employment, adult services, college) or social care provisions.
